The Hancock Inn is one of the oldest in New England. When it opened in 1789, George Washington was in the first year of his presidency.

Continuing on down the street, Arlene noticed the First Congregational Church, which not only houses worship space, but also the Hancock Town Hall. Arlene asked an approaching stranger about this interesting co-tenancy. He explained that the church was on the second floor (closer to Heaven?) and the town offices on the first. He introduced himself as Bob Fogg and invited Arlene to the 4<sup>th</sup> floor tower where he has wound the clock, by hand, since 1965!

Arlene says if she hadn't had responsibilities, and a husband, at the Rally, she might have stayed in Hancock forever!
